

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

با در نظر گرفتن این مهم، نقش نظام رسمی تعلیم و تربیت کشور در آموزش تواناییهای کاربردی زبانهای خارجی به نسل آینده ساز ایران اسلامی برجسته می نماید؛ لذا تهیه و تدوین بستهٔ آموزش زبان انگلیسی، براساس راهنمای برنامهٔ درسی ملی و با توجه به فرهنگ اصیل و هویت ارزشمند اسلامی ـ ایرانی و توانمندی های علمی پژوهشگران کشورمان صورت گرفت. این بستهٔ آموزشی با عنوان English for Schools که حاصل تلاش و کوشش جمع کثیری از صاحب نظران حوزهٔ تعلیم و تربیت از جمله متخصصان زبان شناسی، آموزش زبان های خارجی، برنامه ریزی درسی و . . . می باشد با رویکرد ارتباطی فعال خودباورانه مطرح در برنامهٔ درسی ملی جمهوری اسلامی ایران تهیه و تدوین شده است. لازم به ذکر است، رویکرد ارتباطی حاکم بر کتاب سال اوّل متوسطه پایهٔ اوّل الزاماً بهره برداری از نظرات پژوهشگران غربی در حوزهٔ رویکرد و روش ارتباطی نیست؛ در تألیف کتاب حاضر تلاش بر این بوده است تا با بهره گیری از نقاط قوت روش ارتباطی به مبانی فرهنگی و تنوع کشور نیز توجه شود.

برخی از ویژگیهای این بسته آموزشی

کتاب حاضر با رویکرد تولید بستهٔ آموزشی تدوین گردید و شامل کتاب دانش آموز، کتاب کار، کتاب معلم، لوح فشرده، فلش کارت معلم و . . . است. هر یک از اجزای این بسته تعریف و کارکرد خاص خود را دارد و نمی توان از هیچ یک از آنها در فرایند آموزش صرف نظر کرد؛ لذا فراهم آوردن ملزومات استفاده از اجزای بستهٔ آموزشی بسیار حائز اهمیت است. همچنین بستهٔ حاضر به گونهای طراحی شده که قابلیت آموزش در زمان تخصیص یافته به این درس را داشته باشد.

برای نخستین بار در این کتاب به آموزش هم زمان هر چهار مهارت ارتباطی (گوش دادن، صحبت کردن، خواندن و نوشتن) توجه شده و هیچ یک از این مهارتهای چهارگانه به نفع دیگری کنارگذاشته نشده است. البته بدیهی است برخی از مهارتها در کتابهای مقطع اوّل بیشتر در محور توجه قرار گیرند؛ اما لازم است به این نکته توجه داشته باشیم که مجموعهٔ کتابهای English for Schools یک مجموعه به هم پیوسته شش جلدی است که قضاوت و بررسی نهایی در مورد آن میبایست به صورت مجموعی و کل نگرانه انجام گدد.

یکی از ویژگیهای کتاب حاضر شیوهٔ آموزش الفبا و سوادآموزی است که با شیوههای سنتی و مرسوم در کتابهای پیشین تفاوتهای بنیادین دارد. در آموزش الفبا سعی بر این بود که به شیوهای تلفیقی از نقاط قوت و نیز دستاوردهای رویکردهای نوین آموزش الفبا استفاده گردد. شایان ذکر است هیچ کدام از این رویکردها با وضعیت دانشآموزان کشور ما که از سن بالای دوازده سال آغاز به یادگیری زبان خارجی میکنند تناسب نداشت؛ لذا تلاش بر این بود تا به شیوهای بومیسازی شده از نقاط مثبت رویکردهای مذکور بهره برده شود.

اکیداً توصیه می شود دبیران گرامی برای آموزش بهینه این کتاب، ضمن شرکت در دوره های ضمن خدمت تخصصی بسته آموزشی جدید، کتاب را هنمای معلم را به دقت مطالعه نموده، به شیوه ها و مراحل توصیه شده در این کتاب توجه کافی را مبذول دارند.

بسته آموزشی حاضر به جنبه های مختلف فرایند آموزش توجه کافی نموده و زمینهٔ لازم را برای تحقق اهداف مورد نظر فراهم کرده است؛ لذا استفاده از هیچ گونه کتب کمک آموزشی در کنار این مجموعه ضرورت ندارد.

امید است نتیجهٔ این تلاش جمعی زمینه ساز رشد علمی آیندهسازان میهن اسلامی مان شود. بی شک پیشنهادها و انتقادات سازندهٔ عموم مخاطبان کتاب به ویژه متخصصان و همکاران فرهنگی، پیشرفت و بهبود بستهٔ آموزشی حاضر را به همراه خواهد داشت.
